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Principal Organs of the U.N. (Part. 02)

(A) United Nations Development Programme (UNDP)

United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) is the world's largest agency for the multilateral technical and pre-investment co-operations. It is the funding source for most of the technical assistance provided by the United Nations. Its H.Q. is at New York.

(B) UNICEF (UN International Children's Emergency Fund)

UNICEF established in 1946 as United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund to deliver post war relief to children and concentrates its assistance on development activities aimed at improving the quality of life for children and mothers in developing countries. H.Q. New York, Director: Henrietta H. Fore.

(C) The UN fund for Population Activities

The UN fund for Population Activities (UNFPA) established in 1969, carries out programmes in over 130 countries and territories. The fund's aims are to build up capacity to respond to needs in population and family planning.

Established in 1972, it works to encourage the sustainable development through sound environmental policies.
